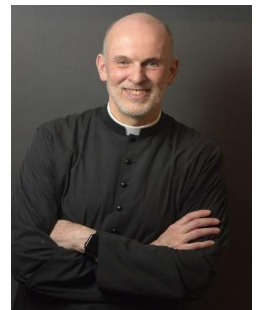
FROM THE PASTORS DESK

One of the greatest challenges today is not time management, but priority management. Time management, in many ways, is an illusion, we all receive the same twenty-four hours each day. **What truly shapes our lives are the priorities we choose.** If we do not intentionally place God first, other things will quietly but intentionally take His place.

Jesus Himself teaches us the right order of life:

“Seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things shall be yours as well.” (Matthew 6:33)

This is why the celebrations of the Ascension and Pentecost are so important for us. In the Ascension, Jesus does not become distant from us. Rather, He reveals our ultimate destiny: we are made for eternal life with God. Every human person needs a purpose, a goal, a reason to live. Jesus shows us that our ultimate purpose is to follow Him into eternal life.

But we cannot do this on our own.

That is why Pentecost matters so much. Jesus made it clear that even the Apostles, who saw His miracles and heard His teaching firsthand, still needed the Holy Spirit. Only after receiving the Holy Spirit did they go forth with courage, conviction, and joy.

The same is true for us.

Our children need the Holy Spirit. Our Grade 7 students have received the gift of the Holy Spirit in Confirmation, but now they must continue learning how to live as disciples of Jesus, listening to the Holy Spirit, forming their consciences, and growing in faith.

As parents and families, this is both a tremendous responsibility and a profound privilege. God has entrusted these children to you. No success in this world can replace a life rooted in God. Again and again in Sacred Scripture, when people placed God first, they flourished; when they turned away from Him, life eventually unraveled.

So let us continue praying for our children. Let us encourage them by our example. Let us make Jesus a true priority in our homes and in our lives!

Thank you to all our parents, teachers, catechists, and parish volunteers who help guide our young people toward Christ.
