TRAFFIC AND CROSSWALK SAFETY DUTY 2026-2027

Each family will be required to complete 3 hours of Traffic and Crosswalk Safety Duty. This will be a mandatory component of the 30 Hour per year parent-participation expectation.

To guarantee fair access, initial sign-ups are capped at 3 hours (six 30-minute sessions) per family. The following week, remaining spots will open for unlimited participation, so you can book as many extra slots as are available. Sign up will be sent out in late August/early September.

Last year, the school created training videos for parents to understand and learn how to do parking lot supervision. Included this year is Nanaimo St. and 48th Ave. Crosswalk.
